

EMT - B (Basic) Course

The EMT-B (Basic) is the basic level of the EMT education program. Student candidates must be at least 18 years of age, be a high school graduate or have a GED equivalent, and possess a CPR Healthcare Provider Certification.

Training consists of a 120 hour didactic course, 16 hours of Emergency Department observation, and 12 hours minimum of supervised field clinical time. Although it's open to all students, students interested in becoming AMT employees are encouraged to do additional field clinical time up to a maximum of 60 hours total.

Topics of instruction will include:

- Basic Anatomy and the Human Body Systems
- Medical Ethics and Legalities
- Patient Assessment
- Airway Management and Oxygen Therapy
- Recognition and Care of Traumatic, Medical and Environmental Emergencies
- Skill development in areas of Bleeding Control, Wound Care, Treatment of Shock, Management of Fractures and Dislocations, Childbirth and Pediatric Emergencies
- Aspects of Pre-Hospital Care and Non-Emergency Care

CPR Requirement

CPR for the Healthcare Provider is a prerequisite for the course. This will be given on August 10th, 2011 at 6:00pm

Licensure

Upon **successful** completion of the course, students may challenge the Illinois Department of Public Health test or the National Registry test. Licensure is granted by the Illinois Department of Public Health for satisfactory scores on either test.

Course Fees and Supplies

EMT - Basic

An EMT - B is a health care provider who has special skills and knowledge in emergency medical care and responds to cases of sudden illness and injury. An important trait for the EMT to exhibit is concern for the health and well-being of others.

An EMT is trained to provide emergency and non-emergency care to patients in the pre-hospital setting. An EMT must provide this care unsupervised, in a great variety of circumstances, and often under considerable physical and emotional stress. This requires special skills in communications, transportation, record keeping and personal safety.



All training is provided in accordance with the EMT-B National Standard Curriculum and Illinois Department of Public Health curriculum guidelines.
